"Fire It Up for Public Safety" During July at Lakeville Liquors

During the month of July, Lakeville Liquors is running a "Fire It Up for Public Safety" campaign to collect donations for water rescue equipment and training for the Lakeville Fire Department.

The Fire Department would like to add rescue swimmer functions to its response capabilities, which would provide the department with the capacity to respond to open water emergencies to help prevent drownings. The goal is to raise enough funds to purchase four sets of rescue swimmer gear, which include dry suits, fins, masks, snorkels, and some additional accessories. Donations will also help pay for water rescue training for firefighters.

STAFF UPDATES

Parks & Recreation

The Dodd Trail pickleball courts opened on Friday, June 23. Six dedicated pickleball courts are now available with a sitting area. A sun shade will be installed over the alcove sitting area in the future. Later in July or early August the trail between the courts and the parking lot will be paved.

The West Lake Marion Off-Road Bike Course project is continuing with the Lakeville Cycling Association completing a number of projects. Staff will be installing gates and signage next.

A two-stall ADA parking area and an access trail to the soccer fields were prepared for asphalt installation as Casperson Park. The contractor is expected to pave the areas in July.

The trail crack filling and fog sealing project is complete. Approximately 27 miles of trail in the southwest section of the City received this preventative maintenance.

Public Works - Utilities Division

The Utilities Division is continuing with its 2017 water meter replacement program and has completed 412 meter replacements so far this year. Additional appointments for meter replacements are being scheduled.

The Division has completed 1,264 Gopher State One Call locates during the month of June.

City Watering Ordinance Now in Effect

Odd/even and time-of-day watering restrictions are in effect May 1 through September 30 each year. Water only on odd-numbered days if your house number ends in an odd number, or even-numbered days if your house number ends in an even number. Also, watering is not allowed between 11 a.m. and 5 p.m. — watering during the heat of the day wastes water.
