St. Paul Farmers' Market

County Road 50 (Kenwood Trail) Reconstruction Project

The County Road 50 (Kenwood Trail) reconstruction project currently consists of street and utility construction, tree clearing and utility relocation. Beginning the week of August 7, work scheduled included paving of the new Icenic Way and removal of pavement on the west side of County Road 50.

Holyoke Avenue Improvement Project

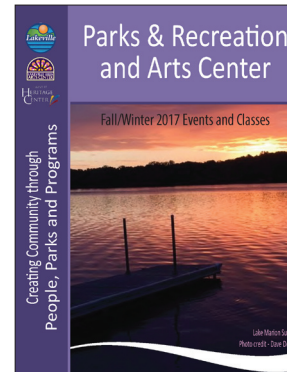
The contractor continues to remove curb on the west side of the business district. Sections of the street are also being removed in preparation for bump-outs at select intersections. Beginning the week of August 7, work scheduled included new curb installation on the north end of the business district. All downtown businesses remain open during this project, which is expected to be completed sometime in October.

COUNCIL MEETING August 7, 2017



The City Council received a \$2,500 grant from CenterPoint Energy for the purchase of rescue swimmer equipment for the Lakeville Fire Department.



A \$10,000 donation from the Lakeville Lions was received for the Parks & Recreation Department for construction of the West Lake Marion Mountain Bike Trail.



The City Council eliminated the "convenience fee" for online utility billing credit card payments.



Proposals were approved for engineering related to the 202nd Street expansion from Holyoke Avenue to Cedar Avenue, and for a new spotlight at Dodd Boulevard and Glacier Way.



The City sold bonds for this year's street reconstruction projects. Eight bidders submitted bids with the low interest rate coming in at 1.95%.
