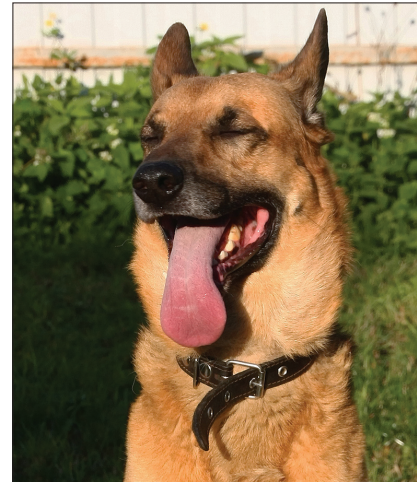
Holyoke Avenue Improvement Project

The contractor has begun replacing curbs on the west side of the business district. This work will continue from north to south through the week of August 14. Storm sewer work is currently underway on the parking lot to the west of the Lakeville Area Arts Center. All downtown businesses remain open during this project, which is expected to be completed sometime in October.

Here are Some City of Lakeville Frequently Asked Questions

Even lifelong residents of Lakeville likely don't know all the inner workings of City policies and protocol. Here are some quick tidbits to remind everyone of some of the lesser known details about City regulations.

- As much as we all love dogs, the maximum number of dogs a resident may have on a property is three. No more than three dogs over six months of age are allowed, except as a licensed kennel allowed within the respective zoning district in which the animals are located.
- It is illegal to park a vehicle on grass in residential areas. The area on which vehicles and equipment are stored must be surfaced with asphalt, concrete or paving brick. No gravel or uncovered ground may be used for vehicle parking in residential districts.
- Inoperable and/or unlicensed vehicles cannot be store outside on property within City limits. No motor vehicle, trailer, boat, snowmobile or seasonal vehicle may be parked, kept or stored outside on any premises if it is inoperable or apparently inoperable, is partially dismantled or in a state of disrepair, or is not properly licensed for operation within the state of Minnesota.

THRIVE! BUSINESS UPDATES

Maynard Johnson, one of the founders of Airlake Airport and Airlake Industrial Park, passed away in July at the age of 95. Mr. Johnson was also instrumental in starting the Pan-O-Prog Community Celebration, which celebrated its 51st year last month. Today, Airlake Industrial Park is home to approximately 150 businesses and 3,500 employees. The total estimated market value of buildings located in Airlake Industrial Park is \$223 million and the total amount of property taxes generated by the park each year is \$7.2 million.

At the July 17 City Council meeting:

The Council approved the construction of a 9,360 square-foot multi-tenant commercial building, which will include a **Dunn Brothers** coffee shop and drive-through service window, located south of 160th Street and east of Pilot Knob Road (west of the Hy-Vee grocery store).

Freddy's Frozen Custard and Steakburgers restaurant with a drive-through service window was also approved. The 3,010 square-foot building will be located south of 160th Street and east of Pilot Knob Road (northwest of the Hy-Vee grocery store).

Platting and a conditional use permit were approved to allow a **Hy-Vee Gas C-store** and a **Starbucks** coffee shop with a drive-through window. This Cedar and Dodd Retail Addition is located east of Cedar Avenue, south of Glacier Way and west of Dodd Boulevard.

Several ribbon cuttings were held recently:

On July 26, **Emagine Lakeville** on 20653 Keokuk Avenue (formerly Muller Family Theatre) held their grand reopening. The movie theater has been completely remodeled and a wide variety of new concession items, including a full bar, have been added.

A ribbon cutting was also held at **Mowers to Blowers Race Shop** at 21225 Hamburg Avenue on August 3. MTB supplies race parts, engine builds, complete project builds and general automotive services.
