

Attend this free workshop to see dozens of beautiful, inspirational and affordable garden designs using native plants to help clean our waters.

Storm sewer inlets on our streets and in our yards go directly to local water bodies. Planting native gardens, rain gardens or shoreline stabilizations can soak in and filter storm water runoff, thereby diminishing the effects of excess runoff and pollutants.

After attending you can sign up to receive design and installation assistance. Some Dakota County residents will also qualify for a \$250 grant (or more) for their new gardens.

General EAB biology, distribution, management, regulation and treatment will also be covered. Workshops are provided free of charge through support from the U.S. Forest Service.
