## COUNCIL MEETING March 19, 2018



The City Council welcomed new members of the Lakeville Police Department, including officers Hayley Springer, Delaney Miller, Brady Letson, Melissa Field, Joshua Phillips, Tyler San Agustin and Community Service Officer Randy Smith.



A senior chore program (funded through Community Development Block Grant funds) was approved and will be administered through a partnership with DARTS.



A Joint Powers Agreement was approved with Dakota County for the engineering and construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Dodd Boulevard and Flagstaff Avenue, with construction occurring in 2019.



An on-sale wine and 3.2% malt liquor license was approved for Life Time Fitness.



Salary adjustments were approved for the Mayor and City Council. Current salaries had not been adjusted since 1999 and are currently \$833 per month for the Mayor and \$722 per month for City Council. Salaries were proposed to be increased to \$1,347 per month for Mayor and \$950 per month for Council. This was amended at the meeting to be set at \$1,250 per month for Mayor and \$833.33 per month for Council. The Council also removed the automatic inflation calculation but left the new payment of \$25 per meeting outside of City Council meetings. The motion passed on a 3-2 vote.
