The annual Household Hazardous Waste Drop-off Day event is open to all Dakota County residents. **A driver's license is required** to drop items off.

Below are some examples of items that will be accepted. Drop-off is free except where a fee is indicated.

Household hazardous waste

The City Council approved temporary on-sale liquor licenses for several downtown businesses for this year's Block Bash on Saturday, June 2. This event benefits the Lakeville Public Safety Foundation.



The City Forester presented information on Arbor Day and the Council proclaimed April 21 as Arbor Day in Lakeville.



A final plat was approved for Pheasant Run of Lakeville Fourth Addition, which consists of a total of 29 plats east of Pilot Knob Road and north of the Farmington/Lakeville boundary.



A contract was approved for reconstruction of Kenyon Avenue (adjacent to the new Lee Lake apartments along I-35).

City of Lakeville Conducting Community Survey

To better serve residents and to learn more about the needs of citizens, the City of Lakeville has partnered with the National Research Center (NRC) to conduct a community survey.

Invitations to participate in the survey were mailed to a random and scientific sample of 1,600 Lakeville households in early April. Full survey packets were mailed to this group on Friday, April 13. If you received this survey, please complete and return it as instructed.

Survey results from this initial random sample will be analyzed. Once that process is complete, the survey will be open on Friday, May 11 in an online format for all residents to provide input.

Citywide Garage Sale is Saturday, May 19

The City of Lakeville is organizing a Citywide Garage Sale on Saturday, May 19 from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Lakeville residents can submit the address of their garage sale to be included on a map of sale locations.

In order to participate in the Citywide Garage Sale and have your location listed on the map, we require the information in the online form for verification purposes. Only your address and items available will be included on the map.

A preliminary map of garage sales will be posted starting on Tuesday, May 1 and will be updated periodically through Wednesday,

May 16, as registrations are received. Registrations received after May 16 and addresses falling outside the borders of the City of Lakeville will not appear on the map.
