Job Opportunities

Police Officer (full-time)

Applicants must be POST licensed or eligible to be licensed by September 1, 2018. \$28.43-\$39.16 per hour.

Learn About Rules for Peddlers and Solicitors in the City of Lakeville

Lakeville residents may see an increase this time of year in door-to-door sales people. Here is some information on the door-to-door sales process and some definitions.

Peddler: Anyone who goes door-to-door attempting to sell items that are delivered immediately upon payment, such as vacuum cleaners or cleaning supplies. Peddlers are first required to obtain a license from Dakota County, at which time they are eligible to apply for a City license to conduct business as a peddler.

Solicitor: Anyone who goes door-to-door attempting to obtain orders for items that will be delivered later, such as magazine subscriptions or other items that may be sold out of a catalog. Solicitors must register with the Lakeville Police Department and will receive an ID card.



Both peddlers and solicitors are required to display their ID card or license, or must present it if asked. Peddlers and solicitors are not allowed to go door-to-door between the hours of 8 p.m. and 9 a.m.

Certain groups or products are exempt from licensing requirements, including anyone selling or taking orders for any product grown or raised on a farm or garden; daily newspaper sales; or the sale of plants, flowers, Christmas trees or cookies by a nonprofit group such as Boy or Girl Scouts.

Residents who would prefer not to be contacted by peddlers or solicitors may display signage on their property indicating "No Peddlers or Solicitors" or "Peddlers and Solicitors Prohibited."

Peddlers and solicitors can be respectful and businesslike, or some may have more aggressive sales tactics. If you are uncomfortable with the behavior of any sales person who comes to your door, if they are unable to show you their City-issued ID or license, or if they refuse to leave your property, don't hesitate to call 911. Remember, you should call 911 for any situation where you need a police officer dispatched, even if you don't consider it to be an emergency.

More than a dozen Lakeville firefighters and police officers (as well as some Lakeville Life Time Fitness customers and employees) were presented with an Allina Health Life Saver award for their efforts in saving a man who suffered a cardiac arrest at Life Time Fitness.
