COUNCIL MEETING July 2, 2018

 Angry Inch Brewing and Lakeville Brewing Company, on behalf of Block Bash, announced that they had raised over \$5,200 during this event for the Lakeville Public Safety Foundation.

 The City Council approved proposals from WSB & Associates and SRF Consulting Group for the master planning processes for East Lake Community Park and Avonlea Community Park.

 The Spirit of Brandtjen Farm Commercial 5th Addition (Wings Financial Credit Union) and 6th Addition (Valvoline Instant Oil Change) were approved.

 The City Council approved ordinance amendments to further restrict motor vehicle salvage sales and to allow the keeping of urban chickens in residential districts.
