Candidate Filing for Mayor and City Council Opens on July 31

Candidates for Lakeville Mayor and Council Member who want their names on the ballot must file between July 31 and August 14. Candidates must be eligible to vote, 21 years of age upon assuming office and a resident of Lakeville for 30 days before the general election on November 6. A signed and notarized affidavit of candidacy must be filed in person with the City Clerk during this time period. New Accessible Mini Golf Course Will Be Added to King Park

The City of Lakeville, along with other community partners, will be adding a new handicap accessible 9-hole mini golf course to King Park. This will be next to the Miracle Field and the fully accessible playground area.

This new mini golf course is the next step in creating additional recreation opportunities for children and adults of all ages and abilities.

The course will be open to all, but the main beneficiaries of the project will be children with cognitive and/or physical disabilities, many of whom already participate in the South Metro Miracle League at the Miracle Field. The goal is to open the course for play in the spring of 2019.

The project will cost between \$325,000 and \$350,000 and will be paid for through

donations and fundraising efforts. No City funding will be utilized.

The Lakeville Lions have already committed to donating \$75,000, and the Lakeville Rotary a minimum of \$25,000, towards this project.

In addition, Lakeville Liquors has so far raised over \$21,000 to help pay for the mini golf course, through a brat feed fundraising event that was held on July 7 and in-store donations from customers.

STAFF UPDATES

Community & Economic Development

Several large commercial and multi-family residential permits have been pulled recently, including Compeer Financial, a new two-story office building near I-35 and County Road 70 (valued at \$4.7 million); the new Bethlehem Lutheran Church (valued at \$3.2 million); KingsPath Senior Housing, 55 senior independent living apartment units (valued at \$8.8 million); Hampton Inn & Suites, a new 117-room hotel near Keokuk Avenue and County Road 70 (valued at \$7 million); and an addition/remodel of Valley Christian Church (valued at \$1.1 million).

Forestry Division

Staff continue to respond to inquiries about the ongoing Ash Injection Program to aid in the prevention of emerald ash borer infestation. Residents can also go to www.rainbowtreecare.com/lakeville to request a free inspection and estimate on treatment of ash trees on private property.

Public Works

County Road 50 Reconstruction

This week's work included grading, utility construction and private utility relocation. Concrete curb and gutter installation between Jaguar Avenue and 192nd Street was also scheduled for this week. Paving between Jaguar Avenue and 192nd Street is scheduled for mid- to late August.

Juno Trail Project Underway This Week

Juno Trail, which connects 205th Street and Caspersen Park along the west side of Lake Marion, is being renovated. The project includes new trail lighting to replace the old infrastructure, installing a bio-barrier to minimize tree root growth that impacts the trail surface, and reclaiming and repaving the trail.

The project could be completed as early as the third week of August, depending on weather. The trail will be closed and marked with barriers and signage when contractors are working.
