October 1-7 Declared Manufacturers Week in Lakeville

The City Council has declared October 1-7, 2018 as Manufacturers Week in Lakeville, to coincide with the state of Minnesota's celebration.

Lakeville's manufacturing companies provide high-skill, high-wage jobs that make significant economic impacts on our community's local economy.

There are approximately 150 businesses in Airlake Industrial Park that employ 3,500 people in the area. There are significant economic impacts for Lakeville, Dakota County and the state of Minnesota due to manufacturing. Manufacturing and other industrial businesses in Lakeville provide more than \$332 million in taxable value and contribute



more than \$9.8 million in total property taxes. It also serves as one of the largest employment sectors in Lakeville, accounting for more than 21% of Lakeville's 16,400 jobs.

COUNCIL MEETING October 1, 2018

The City Council approved a final plat of **Cedar Crossings**, a 50-unit single-family development west of Cedar Avenue. Seventy-three lots remain to be platted.

The Council approved the 2018 **Lakeville Convention and Visitors Bureau** budget (approximately \$250,000).

East Community Park Phase II Online Survey

The City of Lakeville is preparing a master plan for East Community Park Phase II. Your responses will help us further develop the concepts into a single cohesive master plan for the park.

Absentee/Early Voting Is Available

While the General Election will take place on Tuesday, November 6, you can vote absentee now at Lakeville City Hall. Absentee/early voting will continue until 5 p.m. on Monday, November 5. City Hall will also be open on Saturday, November 3 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. for early voting.

Voters must be registered with their current address. Voters who have moved or changed their name since the last election must re-register. The last day to pre-register for the November 6 General Election is Tuesday, October 16. Otherwise you will have to register at your polling place on Election Day by providing proof of residence.
