202nd Street Reconstruction and Roundabout Project to Begin


Dakota County, in partnership with the City of Lakeville, is reconstructing 202nd Street from Holyoke Avenue to Cedar Avenue. The project includes a roundabout at 202nd Street and Holyoke Avenue, traffic signal at 202nd Street and Cedar Avenue, dedicated turn lanes at intersections, a pedestrian underpass (with lighting) and trails along both sides of the roadway, and site distance improvements at Hamburg Avenue by lowering the intersection 11 feet.

Improvements to Aronson Park will also be completed with the project, including relocating access to the park to align with Heath Avenue, regrading soccer fields to add field space and improve drainage, improving parking, and constructing a stormwater re-use irrigation system. The stormwater re-use project will be completed through a partnership between the City, County and Vermillion River Watershed, including grant funding from the Board of Water and Soil Resources.

The project is scheduled to begin in early April (weather permitting) and will be constructed in two phases. During each phase, the portion of 202nd Street under construction will be closed to traffic. Traffic will be detoured along Dodd Boulevard, 215th Street (County Road 70) and Cedar Avenue.

Phase 1: April to July 10

This phase includes improvements along 202nd Street between Holyoke Avenue and



Highview Avenue, including the roundabout. Access to Aronson and Quigley-Sime Parks will remain at the current locations. Detour signs to downtown Lakeville, City Hall, Heritage Library and License Center, and the parks will be in place during construction.

Phase 2: July 15 to November

Following completion and opening of 202nd Street between Holyoke Avenue and Highview Avenue (including the roundabout), Phase 2 will include improvements along 202nd Street between Highview Avenue and Cedar Avenue. Access to Aronson and Quigley-Sime Parks will be at Highview Avenue only. Entry into Aronson Park will be provided through a roadway from Quigley-Sime Park. Detour signs to downtown Lakeville, City Hall, Heritage Library and License Center, and the parks will be in place during construction.

Tree and Shrub Sale Continues Through April 1

Purchase trees and shrubs now through April 1 during the City's annual sale!

Several new items are available this year including Hackberry, Ironwood, Honeylocust (Skyline), Yellowwood, Tamarack, Homefree Nannyberry and Pagoda dogwood.

Trees that are bare root are light and easy to transport but require planting within 1-2 days from pickup. Trees and shrubs offered in pots

require more space to transport and can be planted as time permits.

All trees and shrubs reflect a savings off typical retail prices.

COUNCIL MEETING March 18, 2019

The City Council approved a conditional use permit to allow a 15,394-square-foot addition to Cherry View Elementary. Work will begin this spring/summer.

Public hearing dates were set for this year's assessment hearings related to street projects.

Several agreements were adopted relating to invasive species prevention, lake management and other water quality improvement projects. All agreements are partially funded through grants and/or Dakota County partnerships.

A public hearing was held and an off-sale 3.2% malt liquor license was approved for the Hy-Vee grocery store on Pilot Knob Road.

The Council approved a preliminary plat for Berean Baptist Church, just north of the Heritage Center on Holyoke Avenue.

New agreements were approved with Lakeville Hockey Association and Heritage Figure Skating Club for preferred ice time at Lakeville Arenas.

The Council approved an ordinance restricting residential trash collection to specific days of the week. Haulers will have until February 15, 2020 to comply.
