
Haunted Forest Festival

iPad / iPhone Painting:


Big Abstract Flowers

COUNCIL MEETING August 5, 2019

The City Council formally received over \$168,000 in second quarter donations to the Parks & Recreation Department.

A Joint Powers Agreement with Dakota County was approved for the construction funding for the County Road 70 project, which begins in 2020.

The Council approved a preliminary and final plat for a new Panera Bread restaurant located adjacent to Target.

A preliminary plat was approved for Summer's Creek on property south of Dodd Boulevard, east of Highview Avenue and west of Cedar Avenue.
