It's Time to Prepare for Winter and Snowplowing

Here are some things you can take care of on your property now and some reminders before the snow flies and snowplowing begins.

Winter Parking Begins November 1

Lakeville's winter parking ordinance will be enforced beginning on Friday, November 1. No cars can be parked on the street between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. There is also no on-street parking when it's snowing, until the roads have been cleared.

Mailbox Health Checkup

Inspect your mailbox and post to make sure they are ready to survive another Minnesota winter. Is it secure? Does it lean or extend into the street? Does it have cracks or is it rotting? Is it stable? Will it withstand the pressure of snow as it is plowed to the side of the street? It is each mailbox owner's responsibility to remove excess snow in front of the mailbox to allow for mail delivery.

Garbage Bin Placement

Keep garbage and recycling bins off the road and safely away from snowplows. They should be

placed on the end of your driveway but not in the street, which is a hazard to the bins and to snowplows.

Mobile Basketball Hoops

Mobile basketball hoops should be moved away from the street and be kept out of the right-of-way.

Stakes and Flags

If you are concerned about sod damage, we encourage you to locate the back of the curb along your property line with visible stakes or flags.

COUNCIL MEETING October 21, 2019

The City Council approved gambling licenses for the Lakeville Hockey Association and the Lakeville Lions.

Three new members were appointed to the Technology Work Group.

The Council approved feasibility reports and set the dates for public hearings for next year's street projects.

The Council approved a donation to the Lakeville Fire Department from the Lakeville Public Safety Foundation for a wheeled carrier (to assist in transporting people) and drone accessories.

The Council approved a grant agreement with the US Department of Justice in the amount of \$106,500 for body worn cameras for the Lakeville Police Department.

A public hearing was held and the 9th (and final) Addition for Summerlyn residential development was approved.

The Council approved an annexation agreement with Eureka Township to bring the Airlake Airport entirely into the City of Lakeville boundaries.
