## ***Building Permits Report***

The City has issued building permits with a total valuation of \$126,517,715 through April. This compares to a total valuation of \$116,175,158 for building permits issued through April of 2020.



The City issued permits for 190 single-family homes through April with a total valuation of \$60,590,000. This compares to 187 single-family home permits through April of 2020 with a total valuation of \$56,600,000.

The City has also issued 54 townhome permits with a total valuation of \$11,463,000 through April, compared to 29 townhome permits with a total valuation of \$6,486,000 during the same period in 2020.

Lakeville has issued the highest number of residential permits year-to-date in the Twin Cities followed by Woodbury, Cottage Grove, Dayton and Otsego.
