

COUNCIL MEETING July 1, 2019

The City Council approved the Cedar and Dodd Retail 2nd Addition plat which will be the location for a new 47,000-square-foot medical office building next to the new Hy-Vee Fast and Fresh C-Store.

A preliminary plat and Planned Unit Development ordinance were approved for the Springs at Lakeville, a 260-unit apartment project in the northwest quadrant of Cedar Avenue and Dodd Boulevard. The project will include 13 20-unit two-story buildings with a clubhouse, outdoor pool, car wash and a pet wash station.

The Council approved the sale of \$7 million in General Obligation bonds for the 2019 street reconstruction and Hamburg Avenue projects. The true interest cost for this bond issue was 1.8%, which is near historic lows for the City of Lakeville.
