Remodeled Heritage Library and Lakeville License Center Opens August 1

The remodeled Heritage Library and Lakeville License Center will reopen to the public Thursday, August 1 with an iLAB, interactive children's area and an expanded meeting room. License center customers will find more space for efficient service.

The interim library and license center location at Lakeville City Hall will close at noon on Friday, July 26.

A grand reopening reception for the public will be from 6–8 p.m. on August 1 with a 6 p.m. ribbon-cutting ceremony at the main entrance at 20085 Heritage Drive, Lakeville. The library will be open 9 a.m.–8 p.m. with regular service. The license center will be open for service 8 a.m.–4 p.m. The public can view the license center during the reception but service will not be available.

The library iLAB includes 3D printers, photo scanners and other maker technology. A fireplace lounge offers comfortable seating with a relaxing view. A calming space provides an inclusive and accessible room for people with sensory needs. The expanded children's area includes interactive walls and seating nooks. New meeting spaces can be reserved for group gatherings. The library was expanded by about 2,900 square feet.

The improved license center includes an additional customer service station and more than three times the amount of seating available before the renovation. There is about 1,100 square feet of new space in the license center.

STAFF UPDATES

Engineering Division

On Monday, July 22, County Road 50 opened to vehicle and pedestrian traffic (including the pedestrian underpass) between Holyoke Avenue and Highview Avenue. County Road 50 also closed to all traffic between Highview Avenue and Cedar Avenue for construction of the remaining improvements. Access to Aronson Park and Quigley-Sime Park will be at the Quigley-Sime entrance located at the Highview Avenue and County Road 50 intersection. All improvements are tentatively scheduled to be complete by November 1.

Park Maintenance Division

Tree Trust crew members recently completed their portion of the bocce ball courts at Aronson Park, installing timber borders. Parks staff will complete the grading, restoration and other final additions to the courts in the coming weeks.

The Dodd Pointe playground replacement project began with staff removing the old playground and timber border. Installation of the concrete border is expected to begin the week of August 5, followed by the playground installation.
