

## School Year Safety Reminders

Lakeville Area Public Schools will be back for a new school year starting Tuesday, September 3. With the influx of school-related traffic, drivers and pedestrians alike need to keep safety as the #1 priority. The increase in traffic is unavoidable, but incidents are not. Here are a few reminders for anyone who may be impacted by the back-to-school bustling commute.

The most common incidents involving student pedestrians occur outside of marked crosswalks and intersections. One contributing factor is student departure from school buses. In Minnesota, school buses are equipped with yellow and red flashing lights to indicate to other drivers what the bus is about to do. Flashing yellow lights will be activated at least 100 feet before a school bus stops in a speed zone of 35 mph or less, and at least 300 feet before it stops in a speed zone of more than 35 mph. It is against the law to pass on the right side of a school bus while it is displaying red or yellow flashing lights.

Flashing red lights warn motorists that the school bus is loading or unloading students. When a school bus is stopped with its red lights flashing and its stop arm extended,



you must stop your vehicle at least 20 feet from the bus. Oncoming traffic and motorists approaching the bus from behind may not move until the stop arm is retracted and the red lights are no longer flashing.

Learn to work with Precious Metal Clay (PMC) to create fine silver charms, which will be 99.9% pure silver. The clay will be rolled, textured, dried and then kiln fired. Once fired, students will make the bracelets by using pliers to connect sterling jump rings.



## STAFF UPDATES

### Environmental Resources Division

Staff presented information to the Parks, Recreation & Natural Resources Committee regarding using goats to manage 9.14 acres of woodland at East Community Park. The committee supported using this natural method to control buckthorn in this conservation area.

### Park Maintenance Division

Dodd Pointe playground was opened for play on Thursday, August 22. The paving contractor completed the trail installation and pavement overlay of the basketball court. Staff installed three new benches and is in the process of grading and seeding the site.

### Planning Department

A final plat application and plans have been submitted by Summergate Development for Summer's Creek, which consists of 46 single-family lots and 65 detached townhome units on property located south of Dodd Boulevard and west of the Central Maintenance Facility.

A final plat application and plans have been submitted by Lennar for Summerlyn 9th Addition, which consists of 28 single-family lots located south of 190th Street and west of Holyoke Avenue.
