Come work for the City of Lakeville in a seasonal position!

Maintenance I - Parks: Provide seasonal work in the Parks Division, including boulevard mowing, trimming and pruning trees, sanitation work and general grounds maintenance. Positions available May-August, up to 40 hours per week. General maintenance and mowing hours are weekdays 7 a.m.-3:30 p.m., sanitation hours are weekdays Thursday-Monday 7 a.m.-3:30 p.m. and weekends 6:30 a.m.-3 p.m. \$11.50-\$13.50 per hour.

Maintenance II - Parks: Provide seasonal work in the Parks Division, including ball field dragging and large rotary mowing. Positions available April-October, up to 40 hours per week. Must be able to work through October. \$13.50-\$15.50 per hour.

Maintenance II - Fleet: Provide seasonal work in the Fleet Division, including shop and tool organization, small equipment maintenance, parts pickup, and vehicle and equipment cleaning. Positions available are for six months, April-October, up to 40 hours per week, Monday-Friday 7 a.m.-3:30 p.m. \$13.50-\$15.50 per hour.

Maintenance II - Utilities: Provide seasonal work in the Utilities Division, including assisting with sewer cleaning and televising operations. Positions available are for six months, April-October, up to 40 hours per week, Monday-Friday 7:30 a.m.-3:30 p.m. \$13.50-\$15.50 per hour.

Program Leader II: Plan, promote, lead and assist with recreational programs and special events for children ages 3-12. Must have a genuine desire to work with children in an outdoor setting and have the ability to create a positive, fun and educational program environment for all children, including children with various disabilities. \$10.10-\$12.10 per hour.

Puppeteer: Perform at several Lakeville parks from our mobile puppet wagon with two other puppeteers. Puppeteer knowledge or experience preferred. Must have a valid driver's license and good driving record (puppeteers must drive to various sites with the Puppet Wagon). \$10.10-\$12.10 per hour.

Communications Intern: Assist the Communications Manager and other department staff with the City's communications activities, including providing timely and accurate information to the public. This position is full time during the summer months, mid-May through August. \$11.25-\$14.25 per hour.

Get Ready to Participate in the 2020 U.S. Census

The Census is required by the U.S. Constitution and is done only once a decade. It's important that everyone be counted—when we understand where population growth is occurring, we know where to build roads, parks, libraries, schools, fire stations, hospitals and businesses.

Every household will be mailed an invitation in mid-March to participate in the Census, with several reminders coming after that. The Census consists of only 10 questions that need to be answered for each person living in a household, regardless of age or relationship to others in the household.

No household will receive a paper form with Census questions until after April 1 because

the data is being collected for the first time online. You will be able to complete the Census on any smartphone, tablet, laptop or desktop computer. You will also be given the option to provide your information by calling the U.S. Census Bureau.

If people are missed in the Census, federal funds will be lost for the next 10 years that could pay for education, jobs, housing, highways, health care and more than 50 other programs. And here in Minnesota, we could lose one of our eight U.S. Representatives if our population is not counted accurately.

Watch for your Census invitation in the mail mid-March and be counted!

STAFF UPDATE

Planning Department

Preliminary and final plat applications and plans have been submitted for FedEx Lakeville 2nd Addition, which proposes to combine Lot 1, Block 1 and Outlot A, FedEx Lakeville into one lot for an expansion of the loading docks, workshop and parking lot at their existing facility located in the southeast quadrant of 215th Street (County Road 70) and Dodd Boulevard.


Public Works Department

Dakota County's consultant is nearing completion of the final project plans and specifications for the County Road 70 reconstruction project. Bids are anticipated to be received in the spring with construction anticipated to begin in early summer. Construction of the proposed improvements will be completed in 2020 and 2021.
