
an intimate setting for this unique show, complete with vintage commercials and the magic of live sound effects and musical underscoring.

COUNCIL MEETING July 6, 2020

Policies relating to sustainable purchasing were approved as well as a resolution supporting sustainable infrastructure. Both of these actions will go towards the City of Lakeville's GreenStep Cities progress.

The Council accepted a donation of \$5,000 from The Moments of Lakeville to the Police Department for the purchase of training equipment.

A Small Business Emergency Grant Program was approved and will be funded through the City's allocation of federal CARES Act money. Up to \$10,000 will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis to small businesses impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

Households May Receive 2020 Census Calls or In-Person Visits

The U.S. Census Bureau will conduct multiple follow-up activities aimed at ensuring a complete and accurate census count.

The Census Bureau began making follow-up calls to some households that have already completed the 2020 Census to make sure *everyone* in a household was counted. If the household does not answer a call, agents will leave a voicemail with a 12-digit ID as a reference number. The calls will continue through October.

Starting in mid-July, census takers will begin interviewing households that have yet to respond to the 2020 Census. All census takers will be trained on social distancing protocols. They will be issued personal protective equipment (PPE) and follow local guidelines for their use.
