

City of Lakeville Small Business Emergency Grant Program



To provide emergency assistance to small local businesses in Lakeville adversely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic, the City of Lakeville Small Business Emergency Grant Program will provide grants of up to \$10,000 to small businesses most in need of support.

The Grant Program will be administered by the City of Lakeville Community & Economic Development Department. Grant funds will be distributed until the program allocation is exhausted, up to \$484,694.

If applications exceed the funding available, grant recipients will be selected on a first-come, first-served basis. Staff will notify approved grant applicants via email within 10 business days to request supporting business documentation.

Providing this support will increase the capacity of small businesses with a physical location in Lakeville to survive the current crisis and will help prevent potential future blight scenarios. These grant funds can be used to ensure a business can afford to operate while maintaining the social distancing guidelines for the safety of its employees and customers.

Terms

- Up to \$10,000 grant based on economic injury from COVID-19 related eligible expenses.
- Funds can be used for operating expenses, including rent payments, mortgage

payments, utilities, payments to suppliers or other critical non-payroll business expenses (including expenses related to reopening and personal protective equipment) as approved by the fund administrator.

Eligible Businesses

Businesses must meet all of the following criteria as of March 1, 2020 to be eligible:

- Must be a locally owned and operated for-profit business with a physical establishment in the City of Lakeville.
- Must have at least one employee in addition to the owner as of March 1, 2020 and not more than 25 full-time equivalent (FTE) employees, and under \$1 million in annual revenue.
- Must have been operating since December 1, 2019.
- Must be licensed, in good standing, current on property taxes prior to July 15, 2020, if applicable.
- Must demonstrate a significant loss in revenue since March 15 (no credit score or collateral requirements apply).

You must apply using our online application.

The application will be available at lakevillemn.gov July 27-August 7, 2020.

COUNCIL MEETING July 20, 2020

The City Council proclaimed October 6, 2020 as National Night Out in Lakeville. The date is being postponed from the normal summer date due to COVID-19 pandemic guidelines.

The Council accepted a donation of processed pork valued at \$2,680 to our Fire and Police Departments.

A purchase agreement was approved to acquire the property at 9653 202nd St. W. (adjacent to Antlers Park).

This acquisition will allow for future expansion of Antlers Park.

A Limited Use Permit was approved to allow for installation of entry signs on the I-35 bridges at County Roads 46 and 70.

The Council approved the preliminary and final plat for FedEx 2nd Addition. This addition consists of 88,255 square feet, bringing the total building area to 181,855 square feet.

Bonds were awarded for this year's street projects, Ames Arena parking lot and various water projects. There were 14 bidders on the bonds, and the City received a historically low interest rate of .78% over the life of the bonds.
