Pottery: Wheel Throwing & Handbuilding

Classes begin September 21, ages 15+

Demonstrations will cover handbuilding and basic wheel throwing techniques for beginners, as well as more advanced concepts for intermediate students. Students work at their own pace with both individualized and group instruction.

Homeschool Pottery

September 18-October 9, ages 8+

Students work on the wheel and learn traditional handbuilding techniques to create fun decorative pieces and functional pottery.

Parent-Child Pottery

October 3-24, ages 6+

An introductory course in wheel throwing and handbuilding. Both parent and child must register individually (limit one child per parent).

Classical Painting in Oil

Classes begin September 23, ages 15+

Begin by learning how to paint in the 7-layer method. Demonstrations will cover basic oil painting techniques for beginners, as well as more advanced concepts for intermediate students. Students will work at their own pace with both individualized and group instruction. Instructor will provide personalized art instruction tailored to meet your artistic goals. A list of supplies will be provided at the time of registration. Classes will be held at the Ritter Farm Park/Ed Mako Building.

Alla Prima Oil or Acrylic Painting

Classes begin September 23, ages 18+

Learn alla prima methods that enable you to complete a painting in one session while the paint is still wet. This style of painting is done in a direct, expressive style with minimal preparation. The process can be used for still life, floral, portrait or landscape. Classes will meet at the Ritter Farm Park/Ed Mako building.

STAFF UPDATE

Park Maintenance

Staff held a site meeting with contractors to provide repair estimates for Casperson Shelter A that was damaged recently by a lightning strike. Estimates are expected to be returned in early September.

New park ID signs were installed at Aronson, Ritter Farm and Cherryview parks. Eagle Scouts are scheduled to complete the landscaping in the coming weeks. ID signs are scheduled to be installed at Oak Shores and Valley Lake parks soon.

Staff has been busy working with our partners at Lakeville Liquors to finalize plans for an upcoming membership drive/fundraiser to support Phase II of the Art Walk expansion on the Arts Center grounds.

Public Works

The paving of County Road 46 from I-35 to Cedar Avenue was completed on August 29. The remaining pavement striping and restoration was scheduled to be completed this week.
